ACTA Junior Leader Application

In order to better train ACTA members to become ACTA certified instructors, and to off-load the instructors, we offer Junior Leader program for students at different levels to enter into the instructor program.

Not all students make good instructors, or have the drive to become instructors, and that is okay. We do not require students to move into the instructor ranks unless it is something that both the student and Chief Instructor feel is a good fit for the student. Our goal is not simply to have bodies to assist in class, but to further develop those students who show an aptitude for leading and teaching others.

For younger students – Junior Leader Requirements

For the junior students (age 13 - 17) we have initiated the Junior Leader program. The Junior Leader program is the first step for students under the age of 18 to enter into the instructor program.

All juniors, ages 13-17, that are 1st Decided Black Belts, are eligible to become Junior Leaders. Colored belts 14 & up may also become Junior Leaders if recommended by Chief Instructor. All junior students that wish to become a certified assistant instructor must be in the Junior Leader program for one year, and until their 18th birthday and hold a 2D Black Belt.

All students desiring to become Junior Leader must complete a "Junior Leader" packet. This packet will need to include the following:

1. A brief letter (1 page) explaining why you want to join the instructor group.
2. A List of days/times when you would be able to act as the Junior Leader.
3. Name, address, phone #, and e-mail address (see below).

Responsibilities of the Junior Leader will include the following:

1. Must be schedules for 2 classes per week to be the Junior Leader (JL). If the JL cannot attend class, it is up to the the JL to call at least one week ahead to Chief Instructor
2. The JL is responsible for making sure that other students are keeping busy during the forms section of class, this could mean anything from setting up stations, running one-steps, or simply "policing" the floor.
3. Help the Instructor with equipment both before and after class.
4. Required to attend Instructor's classes on Saturday , twice a month
The rank of 2R Red belt and up and be in the JL to qualify to attend Black Belt or Instructor's Classes.
5. Know all the forms up to your level of belt, one step sparring and break-a-way techniques.

Benefits of being a Junior Leader

1. Qualifies one to become an ATI and eventually a certified instructor.
2. Personal satisfaction that you are making a difference
3. Develop leadership skills
